Extra Help Bus: The Extra Help Bus runs on Wednesdays and Thursdays. The Extra Help Bus is paid for through a special grant to offer students the opportunity to stay after school for academic support. The bus makes 8 stops. It does not stop at student's homes. The bus currently stops at Brockbridge, VanBokkelen, Jessup, Maryland City, and Original Harmans Elementary Schools, as well as in Russett, Seven Oaks and Dorchester Village. Students must have a bus pass to ride the bus. Passes are requested through the teacher for the subject for which the student is requesting extra help. Space is limited to 40 seats per day. Passes are distributed on a first come first serve basis and must be requested in advance. No Extra Help Bus Passes will be issued the same day.

Tenth Grade Parent Conferences: Each month tenth grade teachers, including ELP teachers, are on specific days between 2:15-3:00 in the media center for drop in mini-conferences. These conferences give you, as a parent, a quick way to touch base with all the ELP teachers in person. If more detailed information is needed, parents should contact Mr. Putt, the ELP Counselor, at 410.672.0873 to set up a parent teacher conference. The tenth grade conference dates for first semester are: 10/8; 11/13; and 12/11 and 1/8.

1. Checking the agenda book and/or class calendar daily.
2. Contacting your student's teacher if you want a grade update. Email addresses are on the syllabi for each course. Email is the best way to reach a teacher during the school day!
3. Reminding your student that ELP/IB students always have homework.
4. Reminding ELP/IB students that they live the IB Learner Profile and practice the IB Mission Statement (see study skills book).
